

Medication Instructions for Surgery Patients

Please check the labels of all medications that you take - even those available without a prescription - to make sure you are not taking any aspirin or aspirin-like substances.

If you have been prescribed a blood thinner or are unsure about a medication that you take, please consult the prescribing physician before stopping any medications. Your physician will determine the appropriate use of your medication prior to surgery.

The following is a list of common non-prescription medications that may contain substances that can increase your tendency to bleed:
